 Woolward alias Hayward of Longam in the County of Essex yeoman beinge of whole minde and in good healtte & of free memorye and praye be pnto
 Almightie god this free & voluntarye ordaine and make this my last will and testament in maner and forme followinge first and principally befor
 all other thinge I give & bequeath my soule into Almightie gods my maker redemer and saviour & my bodie I comitt to the earth to be buried in the churchyard of
 Longam aforesaid trustinge and assuredly believinge that I shall live out of the earth in the last daye and for my soules comfort and for the comfort
 of my wife and children I do bequeath unto Marie my wife my remembrance with the yarde and all other the appertinances thereto belonginge whatsoever which I do bequeath
 and all other the appertinances of late purchased of Samuel Wooddon beinge now in my occupation to be pnto Marie my wife duringe her
 naturall life and after her decease I devise and give the said remembrance with all other the appertinances thereto belonginge unto Guyon Woolward alias Hayward my sonne and to his heires
 forever from hence and bequeath unto Marie my wife the two Beddes and three Chestes standinge in the Chamber whome I now use and the halfe parte
 of my Linnen and the halfe parte of my Bras and pewter and one Chubbard standinge in the Hall and one Chayre standinge in the hall and one barrell
 and all the furniture belonginge to her trade of Bakinge and all the poultrie which I shall have at the tyme of my decease and I give pnto
 of good and lawfull money of England duringe her naturall life to be paid unto the said Marie my wife by my Executors hereafter named at fower
 severall paymente in the yeare that is to saye the first paymente to be payd within a quarter of a year after my decease and for quarterley duringe her
 naturall life and further more I give unto Marie my wife my litle tabell and fower forme and two foyred stooles standinge in the hall and whatsoever
 monable the the said Marie my wife shall have at the tyme of her decease I give and bequeath them and to be equally divided betwene my Sonne and my
 daughter Marie shall have then livinge from hence and bequeath unto Arthur Woolward alias Hayward my Sonne the somme of fforty pounds of good and lawfull
 money of England to be paid unto him by my Executor hereafter named at fower severall paymente as hereafter shall be mentioned or specified from hence
 and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth the wife of William Chapman the somme of twenty pounds of good and lawfull money of England to be paid
 unto her by my Executor hereafter named at two severall paymente as hereafter shall be mentioned or specified from hence and bequeath unto my
 daughter Marie the wife of Nathaniell Turner of Littlebury the somme of sixtene pounds of good and lawfull money of England to be paid
 her by my Executor hereafter named at two severall paymente as hereafter shall be mentioned or specified from hence and bequeath unto John Parsley
 my Grandchild the somme of ten pounds of good and lawfull money of England to be paid unto him by my Executor hereafter named when he shall accomplish the
 age of one yere and twenty yeres from hence and bequeath unto him when he shall accomplish the age of one and twenty yeres from my minde and meaninge is that
 my Executor hereafter named shall receive the somme of sixtene pounds of the said twenty pounds upon the Midsummer daye next after my decease
 of my Executor hereafter named from my will minde and meaninge is that my daughter Marie the wife of Nathaniell Turner shall receive the somme of
 the Midsummer daye twelve month next after my decease of my Executor hereafter named from my will minde and meaninge is that my Sonne Arthur
 Woolward alias Hayward shall receive the somme of ten pounds of the said fforty pounds upon the Midsummer daye two yeres next after my decease of my
 Executor hereafter named from my will minde and meaninge is that my said daughter Elizabeth shall receive the other ten pounds of the said twenty
 the Midsummer daye three yeres next after my decease of my Executor as aforesaid from my will minde and meaninge is that my said daughter Marie
 shall receive the other sixtene pounds of the said sixtene pounds upon the Midsummer daye ffore yeres next after my decease of my Executor as aforesaid
 from my will minde and meaninge is that the said Arthur my Sonne shall receive the somme of ten pounds of the said fforty pounds upon the Midsummer
 daye five yeres next after my decease of my Executor as aforesaid and for ten pounds everye Midsummer daye untill the whole somme of fforty pounds
 be paid or satisfied by my Executor hereafter named from hence and bequeath unto Thomas Egge my grandchild one foyred table and
 bequeath unto her within eight yeres next after my decease from hence and bequeath unto Elizabeth Chapman
 my grandchild one foyred Bedde standinge in a Chamber at the Lodge and in the possession of William Egge his father from hence and bequeath
 unto Marie Egge my grandchild one foyred Chayre standinge at the Lodge and now in the possession of William Chapman her father from
 hence and bequeath two bushells of wheate meale to be baked out in fower breads and to be distributed amonge the poore people of the parish of
 Longam aforesaid at the daye of my funerall from hence I do appointe my Executor hereafter named to put forth or binde appoyntee my grandchild
 John Parsley when he shall accomplish the age of fforty yeres or thereabouts All the rest of my goods monable chattels or pntentills of house hold stuffe
 whatsoever not before bequeathed my funerall charges and expences debts and charges beinge paid I give and bequeath unto Guyon Woolward alias
 Hayward my Sonne whom I do make and ordaine my whole Executor of this my last will and testament In witness hereof I the said Thomas
 Woolward alias Hayward have hereunto sett my hand and seale the daye and yere above written
