 memory prayeth to vnto Almighty God for the same yet knowing that my tyme here vpon Earth is but short and my
 life vntertaine I doe hereby make and ordaine this my last will and Testament in Mannes and forme following And
 revoking all other wills by me formerly made first and principally I give and bequeane my Soule into the hand of
 Almighty God my maker Saviour and Redeemer And my body I comitt to the Earth from whence it was taken and to
 be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named I com I give and bequeane vnto Elizabeth my wellbelov'd
 wife All that my ffrooths messuages or Tenement wherein I now dwell with all the yards Barne and outhouses thereto
 belonging for and during her naturall life And after her decease to be and remaine vnto William Wood my Sonne
 And to his heires for ever Upon condition that my said Sonne William Wood his heires or Assignes doe paye or
 cause to be paid vnto my Daughter Sara the now wife of William Judd of Canford or to her heires the full and whole
 Summe of Ten poundes of Lawfull money of England At one whole payment within one whole year next after the
 decease of Elizabeth my wife At or within the Church porch of the ff Parish of Henham aforesaid being their Lawfully
 demanded And if it shall happen that my said Sonne William Wood his heires or Assignes refuse to paye the said
 Summe of Ten poundes at the tyme and place as aforesaid Then I will and give and bequeane All my said ffroo-
 ths Messuages or Tenement with the Barne yards and outhouses what I happen to be thereto belonging vnto
 Henry Wood my Sonne and to his heires for ever Upon condition that my said Sonne Henry Wood shall paye
 vnto my said Daughter Sara aforesaid or to her heires the like Summe of Ten poundes within one year and a
 halfe next after the decease of Elizabeth my wife and if he refuse to paye the said Summe of Ten poundes at
 aforesaid Then I give and bequeane the said Messuages or Tenement what I happen to be thereto vnto my said
 Daughter Sara Judd and to her heires for ever I com I give and bequeane vnto Elizabeth Wood my daughter
 the Summe of ffifty Shillings to be paid vnto her by my Executors hereafter named within one year next
 after my decease All the Rest of my movable goods and Chattells Lease and movables whatsoever I give and
 bequeane vnto Elizabeth my wife and Henry Wood my Sonne whom I make my sole Executor of this my last will
 and Testament for and towards the payment of my debts and funeral Charges In witness whereof I have signed
 this my will to be written read and published and have here vnto sett to my hand and Seale the day & year above written
