

Memorandum: That on or about the fifth day of July — — in the year of our Lord God — One thousand six hundred sixty seven, William Headland of Henham in the County of Essex being a souldier ~~of~~ in his Majesty's service, and being at Wig in the County of ^{Essex} where he was sick of the sickness whereof he dyed, and ^{being} of perfect mind and sound memory, and being minded to dispose of his estate, made and declared his last Will and Testament: Rumpative in these words following or the like in effect:

I viz: My mind and will is that my Father shall have five pounds, IERM I give to my youngest Brother the like sum of five pounds, and to my Brother's son, my God-son five pounds. All wth funds I will shall be paid to the parties above said within three months next after my death, which words or the like in effect were declared and spoken in the presence of Credible Witnesses
