 kyngdom of god and my bodye to the earth from whence
 it came to be buryed at the dyscretion of my next
 exekutors hereafter named I then I gyfte to the poore
 people of this gyfte where it shall please god that
 my bodye shall be buryed and shall be distributed
 amongest them at the daye of my buriall I then I gyfte
 and bequeathe to my son John the pound of Crystram
 Shyre my best pound twelve pence for the
 shall be my son Crystram owte me as he
 well knoweth I lent it to him in readye money when
 I dwelt in Swanstombe forwinge I then I do gyfte
 unto the said Crystram all mye money and other whiche
 as he owte me with in the whole extendeth about the
 sum of fourty pounde as namelye for mye rowthe rent
 of flower pounde for more than yeres past and not
 payed for the eight with I then I do gyfte to my
 pauls requyte ~~in London~~ ~~the rest of mye good~~ I then
 I gyfte to Thomas byrbye my reuerend one thynge with
 a rober to the same all of sylver and double gyll
~~name~~ ~~and to myne byrbye my~~
~~one silver~~ and do with my reuerend wyfe of
 gynt and a sylver spone and to my reuerend daughter
 byrbye for the same gyll sylver spone with a knyfe
 the rest of my plate whiche I have at this tyme I gyfte it to
 my byrbye I regard byrbye and myne for mye byrbye

and assigned for ever, as also all other my good and
rightable right power and authority I have by
~~right~~ wholly freely and fully to the said Thomas
and assigns for ever and assigned so as they paye
unto my son William Savie (whoe purchased me)
the sum of twenty pounds of lawful money
of England for and in consideration of the said
debt to have off ^{me} by my assignement so ^{much} ~~as~~ ^{my} life to me
good and solace And I doe ordeyne and appoint
my brother & heirs by this to be my full and sole
assignator of this my last will and Testament

be written and read before me & some of my
witnesses for unto in the presence of James Twaine
