 mind Land beynge god therfore doe ordaine institute & make thys my Testamēt con
 taininge in it my last wille in such forme & maner as followeth vizt I wille &
 before all other thinges principally I bequeath my soule unto allmyghty god and
 to hys merite & my booke to be buried in the parish churchyard of Henham in full
 assurance that I shall rise agayne in the last dnye after my sayde & resurreynge of
 my lyffe & everlastinge. I the said William Storke do bequeath unto Marye my wyffe
 & to Daniel Storke my sone all that my messuages or Tenement in the parish la
 now dwell called Teytes with my pitell called ~~woodgate~~ ^{woodgate} & my curtyard called
 Tynthelment with the terme of year of lease ground beinge meddow & pastures
 equallie to enjoy the profits thereof by all the terme of the naturall life of Marye
 my wyffe, payinge herefor yearlye unto Lord of the said manor all such rents & duties
 as the lord of the said manor to paye them after the decease of Marye my wyffe
 I the said William Storke do bequeath the said Tenement called Teytes my pitell called woodgate my curtyard
 called Tynthelment with all & singular the dyffinites & buildynges theron to be payed
 unto Daniel Storke my sone & his heires payinge the same yearlye unto my lord of the said manor
 & his heires as he hath heretofore payed & to be payed hereafter beinge a cottage & a prell of Teytes with
 parte of the house called the wheate house adioynge unto the cottage beinge a prell
 of Teytes affore sayd whiche parte reacheth from the said ~~prell~~ ^{prell} cottage unto the great
 beame whiche crosseth over the said wheate house for the south parte to the North parte the
 whiche cottage beinge in the Tenement & occupation of James Granwood with the foreyard abu
 thing appoynted meddowgreene on the west part & my curtyard abuttinge upon the said meddow
 & greene whiche curtyard & foreyard are sometye knowne & called by the name of the
 greene yard all the whiche cottage with the parte of the wheate house as it is before
 mentioned with the foreyard & curtyard called by the name of the greene yard after
 the decease of Marye my wyffe I the said William Storke do bequeath unto Lewis Storke my sone
 & his heires for ever, payinge unto Marie Storke my daughter for the fullmyntes of
 lawfull English monie within one year next ensuynge after the decease of Marye
 my wyffe if the said Lewis Storke shall refuse & not paye unto Marie Storke my
 daughter the said fullmyntes before mentioned at the tyme sett & limited, my wille
 is for the default by him soe made or for the non payment thereof my daughter Marie Storke
 shall have & enjoye the same poynt to her & her heires payinge unto Lewis Storke my sone
 the fullmyntes of lawfull English monie within two years next ensuynge after the
 decease of Marye my wyffe I the said William Storke do bequeath unto Joane Storke my
 daughter the fullmyntes of lawfull English monie to be payed unto her by Daniel
 Storke my sone within one whole year next ensuynge after the decease of Marye
 my wyffe I the said William Storke do bequeath other fullmyntes of the like lawfull English
 monie ~~to be~~ unto Marie Storke my daughter to be payed unto her by my sone
 Daniel Storke within one whole year next ensuynge after the decease of Marye
 my wyffe & if the said Daniel Storke shall refuse & not paye unto my
 said daughter namelye unto Joane Storke & Marie Storke her or their portions

or legates at the time before expressed & limited by me for givene bequeathed
 my will is that for default by him for made, or the no pay met therof my
 two daughters Joane Clarke & Merrie Clarke or the executor of him shall have
 & enjoye his portion to him or either of them their heirs or Assignes for ever
 coming unto Daniel Clarke my sonne former possessor of Lamfild English manor
 within two years next ensuing after the deceasse of Margaret my wife
 & from & unto & bequeath unto Margaret Clarke my wife all my manerables
 & moveables not yet given nor bequeathed my debts payed my bodie brought
 ordered to be carryed & my funerall charges allowed & of this my last will
 I doe ordaine & make him my sole & entire executor & in witness whereof
 unto this present I have put unto my hand & seale the date & year first
 above written.
