 unto almighty God and his mercie my maker, redeemer & saviour & my body to be buried in the parish
 church yarde of Henham, trusting and assuredly believing that, by his death, passion & resurrection I shall
 rise againe in the last daye, & see my saviour and rescue of him lesse then lastinge, Item I give and
 bequeath unto Audric Chace my now wife my house in the which I now dwell with all my land
 then unto belonging with all & singler the appertinances situate & being in Henham during his naturall life
 and after his deceasse I give it unto Audric Chace my brother's sonne, being my godson & I give &
 bequeath unto my saide wife Audric Chace one Acre of free Land lying & being in Boxendonfeld
 during his life naturall & after his deceasse I give it unto the above named Henry Chace
 my godson & I give & bequeath unto Audric Chace my wife all my moveables, these thinges
 onlie excepted namelie one rebord, one benchbord, a Table, with all the painted clothes in the hall, & one
 kneadingtrosse one Auerne one stall one other table with the fore then unto belonging which shall
 continue still in thre myr houses to the use of Henry Chace my godson & I give unto Audric
 Chace my brother's sonne to be paid unto him with in two years next ensuing after my deceasse
 I do give & bequeath unto Mella Mayes of Henham I give & bequeath unto Audric Chace my wife
 all my moveables & emoveables what so ever not as yett given nor bequeathed, my debtes paid by body
 being brought orderlie to the earth & my generall charges allowed & of thre my last will & testament
 I do make my now wife my sole & onlie Executrix, earnestly requesting Anthonic Munday
 to see thre my will performed alowng ymi for his paymes & In witness whereof unto thre my
 will I have put unto my hand & scale the day & yeare above writte In the presence of
